YERBA BUENA ANGLING CLUB Organized 1938

To understand the history of the Yerba Buena Angling Club one must look at the Clubs Constitution which clearly states that the purpose of the organization is to ".....promote interest in the sport of angling and to sponsor and encourage the precept of good sportsmanship among all participants. As its further purpose, YBAC shall: (a) cooperate with authorized Federal, State, and Local officials in enforcement of conservation and angling laws; (b) foster the preservation and continuance of sport fishing in the State of California, particularly in the San Francisco Bay Area; and (c)promote, encourage, and support reasonable and proper legislation to accomplish these objectives."

Several friends interested in the sport of fishing became the founders of the YBAC. Founding members that were identified are:

Bertram Friedberg Frank Lachman Henry Rude Jules Sahlein

As can be seen the membership consisted primarily of the Jewish persuasion. Membership was limited to 50 persons. The membership was increased to 75 in 1968, to 100 in 1985 and the limit removed in 1989.

Henry Rude, a founding member also served as the Clubs first president. The Club grew by word of mouth as members brought in other family members, friends and aquaintances. Membership dues were \$5.00 per year and remained unchanged until 1976 when they were increased to \$15.00 per year.

The need for some structure was recognized and the Executive Board was established. A President, Three Vice Presidents (First, Second and Third), Treasurer, Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary and Six members on the Board of Directors. The Immediate Past president was later added to the directors to present continuity.

Monthly dinner business meetings were held and the club activities were established. The meetings were held at different locations to accomodate the members. Locations are too numerous to mention but include Castagnola's at Fishermans wharf, Bruno's in San Francisco, Leaning Tower in South San Francisco and the Bold Knight in Sunnyvale. This is but a small listing of some of the meeting sites.

Although the Club activities were and are primarily fishing. social events involving participation by family members and friends were held and continue to be enjoyed.

2011 Supplement

This **YBAC HISTORY** was produced in 2001 through the efforts of George Samoulides. Updates for 2002 through 2011 have been made where needed and when available, including the following about membership, by Bob Galvin and Rangal H. Yorks.

Membership continues to evolve. The founding members, and then most of the members, were Jewish. Then the Greek members became the majority. Now, more and more members are fisher people. Dues are \$35.00 a year. The membership now includes four Honorary Life Members – George Samoulides, Steven Saribalis, Abben Simon, and Rangal H. Yorks.

Two groups were added to the primary group of regular members: A member may become an <u>Associate Member</u> for reasons considered valid by the Board. This includes incapacitation and moving some distance away from the Bay Area. <u>Honorary Associate Members</u> are widows of members. This allows them to keep in touch with the Club activities.

In 2010, the Executive Board approved having women as YBAC members. The first woman to become a member was the renowned Captain Jacky Douglas, the skipper/owner of the WACKY JACKY, berthed at Fisherman's Wharf, S.F.

A cap has been applied to the membership at 93 regular members in order to maintain a balance between members who want to fish and the space available, usually 25, on the chartered party boat. The Board is seeking an alternate solution.

Social Events

Most of the following information is based on records available from 1968 to the present. It is by no means intended to be inclusive of all of the Club's activities. Ladies Night – From at least 1968, the Club's highlight event of the year has been Ladies Night. We honor our special ones with a grand night out, including a full dinner, a gift, and dancing. Included is the installation of the elected Board and the awarding of fishing awards.

Greek Night – The membership felt that an event was needed to stimulate participation of family and friends and introduce others to the Club. A Greek Taverna Nite was suggested and this idea generated enough interest to continue the program for ten years starting in 1979. The event also produced some needed funds to the Club's treasury and was a sell out each year.

Picnic – A picnic was first shown to take place with a barbeque at the Krug Winery and then there was a picnic every year thereafter. The locations changed but from 1981 through 1991 the site was Paradise Park in Tiburon. A kids fishing event was also included at the park since it was by the San Francisco Bay. Since 1992, except for one year, the picnic has been in the Junipero Serra Park in San Bruno.

Crab Feed – It was felt that a seafood event was appropriate for our Club. Each December, starting in 1990, up to 300 people gather to have a full dinner including all the cracked Dungeness Crab one can eat. Members, as volunteer workers, have become famous for offering the best Crab Feed in the area!

The funds raised are important in the support of the Derbies, Ladies Night, and other functions. Fishing Derbies are set by the Executive Board for each year. There are two fishing trips for each species of fish that make up the Derby and determine the winners. The most common fishing Derbies are for Salmon, Striped Bass, and Halibut. Ling Cod, Shark, Sturgeon, and Trout have also been included in the past as either Derbies or events.

Largest Fish Awards

To encourage members to fish in their own, an awards program was established in 1972. Awards are given to members for the 2 largest fish caught for the species included in Derbies that year. Derby fish are not eligible.

YBAC recorded winners of the Largest Fish by Category are:

Salmon – 47 lb 2 oz in 2003 by Rocky Lombardi. Striped Bass – 34 lb in 1975 &1976 by Tom Tjovenos. " " 34 lb in 1987 by Bandar Al-Saud. Halibut – 40 lb 8 oz in 2004 by Rangal H. Yorks Sturgeon – 143 lb in 1977 by Quen Young.

There are possibly others with weights that could change these figures, since all weights are not known and several of the earlier years' data is not available. These figures are from the records available.

Fishing Events

Many events have taken place such as fishing for Trout, bottom fish, shark, and albacore. Fishing groups have been on fishing trips to Baja and various lakes in the states.

Jules Sahlein Award

The Jules Sahlein Award was established in 1978. Jules Sahlein, a founder of the YBAC, was a very generous person. giving not only of his time but with financial help as needed. When he passed away in July 1976, the members approved the awarding of a trophy in Jules' name to a deserving member within the guidelines established.

The purpose of the Jules Sahlein Perpetual Award is to give recognition and express appreciation to a member for outstanding contribution to the sport of angling, giving unselfishly for the betterment of YBAC, giving of time and effort towards fulfillment of duties, and outstanding sportsmanship and fellowship.
